Dates: June 17 - 21 or June 24-28 (One Week Course)


Monday-Friday 8 am-12 pm

#### High School Courses

#### RVA-LED LIVE HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT COURSES

We are offering these live, online summer school courses to any student who has completed grades 8-11.

The course cost is \$150. Courses will run Monday, June 3, 2024 - and Thursday, June 27, 2024. Before summer school begins, students will also be required to attend an online orientation. The student/family is responsible for the cost of the course.

High School Credit Elective Courses with Live Instruction\* – Students in these courses are required to spend 1.5 hours per day online receiving daily direct instruction via Zoom and an additional 2 hours per day completing assignments. Students must have regular access to a laptop or computer with a stable internet connection. Interested students may check out a Chromebook from C-FC for the term of the course.

To assist us with planning purposes, please submit your course requests as soon as possible and no later than May 3, 2024. *Please note these classes are offered throughout Wisconsin and they will fill up quickly.*
