

Student Lockers

Students are provided with an assigned locker and are expected to use the locker for personal belongings. Each student is responsible for the condition of his/her locker, both inside and out. Students are not allowed to write, mark, deface, or paste on locker doors. Magnets may be used to hang items on and in lockers. Students may be financially accountable for damage to lockers.

Students are to keep the locker assigned to them. Students may not move to an empty locker or trade lockers. The school is not responsible for lost, damaged or stolen items. Students are not to prevent lockers from locking. Students who decide to “jam” a locker will be responsible for the costs of any repairs.

A school locker is provided for the convenience of the student to be used solely and exclusively for the storage of the student’s wearing apparel and school-related materials during the time the student is attending school. No student shall use the locker for any other purpose. The locker is assigned to a student but remains the property of the District. At no time does the District relinquish its exclusive control of the lockers. Locker searches may be conducted as determined necessary or appropriate without notice, without student consent, and without a search warrant. Locker searches under this policy may be conducted by the District Administrator, a principal, a school employee specifically designated by the District Administrator or other law enforcement official who is acting at the request of or in conjunction with school authorities. As lockers are the property of the school district, school personnel may search them if it is believed that the lockers might contain illegal substances, stolen property, or articles that might endanger the lives or welfare of other students in the school.
