



Special School Board Meeting 10/2432022

The board adopted the 2023-24 total school tax Levy of \$3,924,622. The mill rate for this levy will be 7.02 per \$1,000 of equalized assessed home value. This includes a maximum fund 10 levy of \$2,887,209, fund 39 levy of \$890,263, and a fund 80 levy of \$147,150.

Office Terms

The term of office for school board member is three years or one year for the vacancy beginning on Monday, April 22, 2024. A description of the school district boundaries can be obtained from the school district office.

A Campaign Registration Statement and a Declaration of Candidacy, must be filed no later than 5:00 p.m., on Tuesday, January 2, 2024, in the office of the school district clerk.

Primary Election

If a primary is necessary, the primary will be held on Tuesday, February 20, 2024.

Additional Information

Acceptable Photo ID will be required to vote at this election. If you do not have a photo ID you may obtain a free ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.

Student surveys and group discussions along with employee surveys, professional learning communities, and school improvement teams have provided a valuable guide to areas needing attention as well as areas to celebrate and build upon. The administrative team is committed to collaboration, all opinions being heard, and providing timely feedback.

Goal 2: Establish the "Portrait of a Pirate" readiness indicators district wide. Students learn in a variety of ways. They should be able to demonstrate readiness in a variety of ways. Our "Portrait of a Pirate" readiness indicators are developed from research, more accurately reflect the educational landscape of the 21st century and define students as more than a test score. Our three readiness pillars include attendance, grades, and co-curricular involvement with other pillars for college, career, and life readiness.

Goal 3: Focus organizational efforts on expectations and engagement to fuel student and staff success. To ensure instruction is occurring at high levels, we have made a commitment to verifying the essential learning outcomes, aligning them with the standards and establish quality assessments. We recommitted to collectively holding everyone accountable to the rules and expectations while meeting those levels with equal engagement of students in the learning process.

Goal 4: Cultivate public trust, commitment, and confidence through open, honest communication. We believe community involvement and engagement are essential. In this pursuit, we have expanded our efforts on Facebook to showcase our students and staff. We have also increased our presence as a staff at school and community events to engage stakeholders and show our pride.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS OR DELAYS

Dear Parents, Guardians, Students, Staff, and Community members,

As we enter the winter months, I felt it important to communicate our district's procedures for closings or delays and request your understanding as we begin the winter months. As a school district, our 2023-2024 school calendar has three (3) days built into the required state clock hours for potential closures, so we will not be making up the first three days. However, different this year, the school board decided to have the next three days that school is canceled to be made up in person on the in-services days, sequentially, in March, April, and May. Any additional days will be providing virtual learning days on the day of closure.

On days we are aware of or anticipate inclement weather, district transportation personnel will be assessing the situation in all areas of our school district beginning around 4:45 a.m. Which includes inspecting roads, speaking with Department of Transportation personnel, and, at times, I will drive the roads myself to get a better feel for the conditions. In most circumstances, the decision to close or delay will be made by 5:30 a.m.

Our school buses are very safe for children, they are heavy, well-maintained, and driven by well-trained and qualified individuals here at Cochrane-Fountain City. In inclement weather conditions, students are much safer in buses than in cars. Additionally, snow itself rarely closes school. The fact that there is a snowstorm approaching shouldn't be overly concerning. Visibility, road conditions, ice build-up, and the status of plowing are more important issues to consider.

The district understands that many families need to make alternate arrangements for their children when school is delayed, canceled, or dismissed early. These are stressful times for many parents. The whereabouts and safety concerns of children are paramount for parents and educators. The best advice I can give is to work on developing a network of support that can react and adjust to changing conditions when the weather becomes a problem. I want to reiterate that parents are the final authority as to whether or not they believe it is safe for their child to go to school. If you feel it is too cold, the snow is too deep, or the weather is too unsettled, your decision may be to keep your child home.



News from the Pirate Kitchen

The foodservice department is back in full swing! The cooks are trying some new recipes that have been well received and more scratch cooking is taking place. Thank you for all the extra effort the staff does each day!

A few quick reminders for parents and staff, the State of Wisconsin requires the school nutrition staff to provide meals that meet state guidelines. The three-component breakfast meal consists of a student taking one grain and a ½ cup of fruit or vegetable and a third component choice from milk, meat/meat alternate, an extra grain, fruit, or a juice. A three-component lunch meal must consist of a meat/meat alternate and a ½ cup of fruit or . vegetable; the third component may consist of milk, a grain, and extra meat/meat alternate, or an additional fruit or vegetable. A student has the option of using the daily salad bar to meet the ½ cup fruit or vegetable requirement. If a student does not meet the required guidelines set by the State of Wisconsin, the meal must be charged at full adult price. Please help us educate students on the state guideline requirements.

Free and Reduced Meal applications are available at any point during the school year. All families are encouraged to apply. An application can be picked up at the Main Office, by contacting Amanda Brakke, or by following the link below.

CFC's meal account policy states that any family lunch account that falls negative \$50 will be froze. No charges will be allowed, and meals will have to be sent from home until the Balance is brought back to a positive balance.
